

> \$2/Week

• Adds one potential bone marrow donor to the Be The Match registry (Source: Be The Match)

> \$10/Week

- Provides two weeks of temporary housing for someone recovering from a bone marrow transplant (*Source: Be The Match*)
- Helps pay annual repair costs of wheelchairs or other medical equipment for someone living with muscular dystrophy (Source: Muscular Dystrophy Association)
- Pays for screening 20 people who are at risk for kidney disease (Source: National Kidney Foundation)

> \$10 Donation

- Connects 250 people to mental health materials and resources that raise awareness about mental health conditions and offer strategies for recovery and wellness (*Source: Mental Health America*)
- Provides educational materials for a patient recently diagnosed with pancreatic cancer (Source: Pancreatic Cancer Action Network)



> \$25 Donation

- Covers one clinic visit co-pay for a bone marrow transplant patient who must visit the transplant clinic daily or weekly during their three to six months of outpatient recovery (*Source: Be The Match*)
- Provides an at-home fecal immunochemical test (FIT) test for a person in need of colon cancer screening (*Source: Colon Cancer Alliance*)
- Gives 20 people access to an anonymous, online mental health screening that can help them better understand their mental health (Source: Mental Health America)

> \$50 Donation

> \$100 Donation
